**Metro Theatre presents *There Goes the Bride* February 22 to March 22**

Three-quarters farce and one-quarter musical, *There Goes the Bride* is one entirely good time

**(January 27, 2014)** Take a hilarious comedy by Ray Cooney and John Chapman, add a handful of Fred Astaire and Ginger Rogers-style song-and-dance numbers, and toss in a dash of 1920's glamour, and you've got the delightful *There Goes the Bride*, on stage at Metro Theatre February 22 to March 22, 2014.

The morning of his daughter Judy's wedding doesn't go as planned for workaholic Tim Westerby: When Tim gets a knock to the head, the resulting concussion causes hallucinations that begin with the appearance of a 1920's flapper named Polly. Not only does Tim's family not see Polly, but they have to deal with Tim insisting that Polly thinks he's wonderful.

A second knock to the head leads to further complications for Judy's family: Tim now believes he is Fred Astaire, and Polly is his Ginger Rogers. He is so entrenched in his hallucinated world that he starts to audition for a man he thinks is a Hollywood producer. It wouldn't have been a complete disaster, except that this producer is actually the father of Tim's soon-to-be son-in-law. This is not at all what Judy had in mind for the first meeting of the two sets of parents!

Can Judy's family salvage her special day? Will her fiancé's father forgive her family's antics? Will her father recover from the concussion? And will her grandfather ever stop laughing?

Sprinkled with classic songs like "Cheek to Cheek" and "Steppin' Out with My Baby," *There Goes the Bride* is three-quarters brilliant farce and one-quarter sweet musical. Those with a taste for romantic comedies will adore the delightful song-and-dance numbers, and farce-lovers will be in stitches as the hysterical story unfolds.

Says director Catherine Morrison about what drew her to *There Goes the Bride*: "There are many things that I love about this play. Firstly, the singing and dancing – I've loved paying homage to the dancing style of Fred Astaire and Ginger Rogers. And I really like the setting, which gave me a chance to dress up my female actors for a society wedding. And, one of the characters is a flapper, and I love the 1920's – the music, the fashion, everything."

And Morrison has added another dimension to the play, through the music: Although not technically a musical, she decided to add instrumental accompaniment to the song-and-dance numbers. "I really like the music – it's either toe-tapping or dreamily romantic. I think it will be a colourful, happy show with some memorable characters."
